Park Overview:

High bluffs overlooking Lake Erie provide a breathtaking view and world class sunsets for visitors to Lake Erie State Park, located in historic Chautauqua County. Established in 1928, this 355-acre scenic park has campsites and cabins nestled among wooded areas and rolling lawns. Those seeking to take advantage of the plentiful recreational opportunities Lake Erie has to offer cannot go wrong at Lake Erie State Park with its nearly mile long beach, and its convenient location between Dunkirk and Barcelona Harbors. The park lies squarely within the Lake Erie Concord Grape Belt Heritage Area giving visitors good access to one of New York State's unique cultural resources as well as many fine wineries. In addition to taking advantage of traditional summertime camping, picnicking, fishing and sports amenities; patrons can enjoy excellent bird watching during the spring and fall migrations due to the extraordinary variety of bird life that passes along the lakeshore. During the winter months, visitors can cross country ski on groomed trails that traverse the park's forests.



GENERAL PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- All campers must register before setting up.
- The maximum number of occupants per site/cabin is six.
- Parking - only two vehicles per site/cabin are permitted and must be parked on the site's/cabin's gravel pad. All other vehicles, including boats on trailers, must be parked in the campground parking lot.
- Water hydrants are to be used for filling up only; they may not be used for an extended time as "hook ups".
- Quiet hours are observed from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m.
- Alcoholic beverages must be confined to the campsite/cabin. The use of alcoholic beverages by minors is prohibited.
- Tying rope to trees for any purpose is prohibited.
- Refuse - please place trash and recyclables in designated containers located in the campground parking area. Receptacles for fish scraps are no longer provided. Please dispose of them off site
- Wastewater - A dump station is provided at the entrance to the campground. Dumping of sewage and gray-water on the ground is strictly prohibited.
- Pets - A current Rabies certificate must be presented for each pet. Pets must be on a leash that is no more than ten feet in length. Limit of two pets per site/cabin.



What to do at Lake Erie State Park:

- 102 campsites; 83 with electric and 19 without; 10 cabins
 - Rentals for your picnic, party or special occasion- pavilion or gazebo.

 - Picnic, hike the trails and beach, play volleyball, basketball or baseball.
 - The first public disc golf course in Chautauqua County opened at Lake Erie State Park in 2015!
 - Swimming.
 - Recreation Hall.
- Help Keep Lake Erie State Park "Green" and Healthy**
- Turn off electrical devices and appliances when not in use.
 - Separate recyclable materials and place them in designated bins in the campground parking lot.
 - Instead of driving, walk or bicycle to get around the park.
 - Use refillable propane containers instead of disposable containers.
 - Do not bring firewood into the park from outside the local area. Approved firewood is available at the rental office for \$5.00 per bundle. Also do not remove firewood from the park as it has been confirmed that Emerald Ash Borer is present.
 - Do not burn garbage in campfires.
 - Clean up after your pet.
 - Check your campsite for litter before checking out.

LONG POINT STATE PARK ON LAKE CHAUTAUQUA

Park Overview:

Long Point, which juts peninsula-like onto Lake Chautauqua, is one of the moraines left long ago by a retreating glacier. The park and marina comprise a day-use area with thickly wooded areas of beech, maple, spruce, poplar and oak. The park's boat launch is the most modern on Lake Chautauqua, which at 1, 308 feet above sea level, is one of the highest navigable bodies of water in North America. The lake has a plentiful supply of bass, perch, pike and other types of fish, but fishermen come to Chautauqua to fish for Muskellunge, or muskie, which are native to the lake, noted for their size, often more than 20 inches long, and their "fight". In winter, visitors can cross-country ski, snowmobile or ice fish.

Park Overview:

Located on the shores of beautiful Chautauqua Lake, Midway State Park is a family treasure. Originally established in 1898 as a trolley park, Midway State Park is one of the oldest continually operating amusement parks in the nation. Patrons can take a nostalgic ride on the vintage carousel, play a game of mini golf, take a spin on the tilt-a-whirl, ride the go-karts and bumper boats or watch their children enjoy themselves on the many kiddie rides. And, while some may prefer to relax while enjoying an old fashioned candy apple or cotton candy, others can test their skills at classic midway games. Accessible by the waters of Chautauqua Lake, Midway is also a great place for fishing and free docking is offered for day visitors.
